

A key goal of public health education is to teach young children how to care for themselves and others. Simple practices like handwashing can reduce illness and support community health. The BCCDC Community Antimicrobial Stewardship Team partners with Kids Boost Immunity to offer engaging activities and lessons that build science and health literacy and promote healthy behaviours in school-aged children.

WHAT IS KIDS BOOST IMMUNITY (KBI)?

KBI is a free, BC-based online educational resource developed specifically for educators to deliver curriculum materials in a highly engaging way. There are close to 700 lessons available for teachers that span grades 2-12 with thousands of lesson plan resources in French and in English. A unique aspect of KBI is how learning can help save lives; **every time a student scores 80% or more on the fun knowledge-check quizzes at the end of the lesson, they earn a life-saving vaccine that is donated to UNICEF Canada.**

USING KBI IN MY CLASSROOM

- **Teach health and science** concepts in a fun, age-appropriate way
- **Support classroom discussion** about germs, vaccines, and helping others
- **Build digital literacy skills** through online learning activities
- **Support independence** through meaningful tasks at different levels
- **Promote global citizenship** by earning vaccines for children in need
- **Support student capacity** through tools for calm vaccine clinics

By doing the lesson and passing the quiz, students earn vaccines for children in other countries.
